BYRAM MIDDLE SCHOOL UNIFORM DRESS CODE

Article	Color	Style	How to Wear
Tops/Shirts	Solid No patterns/symbols Maroon or White	Collared – button down or polo style *Shirts must have a collar. T-shirts are not allowed.	Shirts must be tucked in – males and females.
Undershirts	Solid No patterns/symbols Maroon or White		
Outerwear Acceptable outerwear is cardigan, crew neck, or V-neck vest, or zippered sweaters. Sweatshirts, sweaters no more than one size too big or one size too small may be worn. A dress code top must be worn under the outerwear. Outerwear may be worn in the classroom.	Solid No patterns/symbols Maroon , White or Gray		
Winter Coats/Light Weight Zippered Jackets	Any Color	Acceptable winter coats or zippered jackets will have no pictures depicting group affiliation, drugs, alcohol or obscenities.	
Bottoms/Pants/Shorts/Skirts	Khaki (Tan) or Navy	*No jeans or jeggings.	Bottoms/Pants must be worn at the waist. If pants have a belt loop, a black or brown belt must be worn. Shorts/skirts must be no more than two inches above the knee.

Accessories, such as scarves and ties, must be solid white or maroon.

Caps, hats, bandannas, "do rags", sweatbands, headbands, hair picks, rat-tail type combs or other head coverings are not to be worn in the school building or on the school bus.

Shoes: NO CROCS, NO SLIDES, NO FLIP FLOPS. All other shoes must have backs on them.

SPIRIT DAY

On Friday, students will be required to wear khaki/navy bottoms but are allowed to wear a Byram Middle School spirit shirt/t-shirt, any color. Options would include club t-shirts, team t-shirts, band t-shirts, etc.

Shirts must still be tucked in and a black or brown belt worn.

CONSEQUENCES FOR DRESS CODE VIOLATIONS

If a student fails to comply with the Byram Middle School Uniform Dress Code, he or she will be permitted to call home and placed in In-School Detention until the appropriate article of clothing is brought to him or her. Students will receive a detention.
